The knowledge of Scripture in the upper classes and of some of the scholars in the lower classes is very creditable. The writing of a narrative of Scripture from memory is satisfactory. The Arithmetic, particularly in the lower classes, was very correctly worked. The Reading in the different classes is very good, the only exception being in infants. Note Texts of Scripture should be committed to memory and a little time devoted to Geography. The Discipline is extremely good, being tempered with firmness \& kindness.

" 31. Master unwell \& was consequently absent from school the greater part of the morning.

April 4 An unusual number of children are being detained at home this week. Several are ill \& others
are helping to lighten busy times at home. The damp weather \& East winds are accountable in some measure for the illness of some.

April 6. Test examination held to-day; consequently time table arrangements were not followed in the afternoon.

There will be given the usual holidays this Easter; i.e. tomorrow (Good Friday) and Easter Monday afternoon by permission of the Managers. The Rev. H. Buckston visited the school this morning.

April 13th Test examination held this morning by the Rev. H. Buckston, in Arithmetic and Dictation, with the following results.

April 18th The attendance is much improved, but still several are absent through illness.
" 20 The Rev. H. Buckston again kindly examined the Standard children in Arithmetic and Dictation this morning. The results are tabulated in the second columns of the previous page, of this book.
" 24th Over ninety children are present this afternoon- an unusually large number for a Monday.
" 26 To-day we have the largest ordinary attendance that the school has known since the coming of the present master. 100 were present this morning and 101 this afternoon.
" 27 Arthur Chapman (No. 2 Standard Boys' Register) came again this morning. I marked him "left" only yesterday having heard that he had done so.

May 2nd The Rev. H. Buckston kindly examined the Standard children in Arithmetic this morning. The results are tabulated on the table in entry of April 13th 1882.

May 5th The school was opened rather earlier than usual so as to allow of school closing at 4 o-clock and still to secure the usual period of attendance. The register closed as usual. The outlook for the coming examination is hopeful. The three R.s should be well done especially in the upper Standards. Stand. I is more backward than the corresponding Stand. Last year. The infant[sic] examined last year were very backward hence in some measure our Stand I is suffering the consequence.
" 8 The classroom desks have been brought and fixed to-day; the room is now quite finished \& in use - the walls are not yet coloured, because the plaster is not sufficiently dry in all parts.
" 9 I was in the classroom hearing the lessons of the pupil teachers when one of the children came and told me that Mr Lott was in the lane. I thought it wanted still a minute or two to nine, so did not immediately call in the children. Subsequently I found my watch was later than I thought, so that it was after time when the children were called in - probably about five minutes after nine.

May 11th - Time table arrangements are being suspended for a while to give the children a final examination on paper. The lower Standards are working as the time table shows, with little exceptions.

10 Drawing taken the morning - the children have not
yet been placed in their new Standards because the Duplicate Schedule has not arrived.

May 19 Drawing again taken - the Duplicate not arrived
May 22 Drawing this morning - duplicate not arrived. An unusually good attendance for the time of the year is notable to-day - 87 children present. The Rev. H. Buckston \& 2 ladies visited the school this morning. Two children (Abel \& William Darwent) have been sent home because a younger brother has fever, until the sufferer is better, or assurance given from the medical gentleman attending him, that the fever is not infectious.

May 25th Drawing taken this morning from half past eleven and this afternoon from 3.30. We are daily expecting the arrival of the Duplicate Schedule. A heavy shower in the dinner hour has diminished the attendance. The week promised to be one of an exceptionally good average.

The Rev. H. Buckston and Capt. A.P/ Arkwright R. N. visited the school this afternoon.

May 26th Mr Lott H.M.I. of Schools visited the school this morning and heard the P.Teachers' repetition. Later the Rev. H. Buckston brought the Notice for the Drawing examination, \& form for filling in Number of Candidates - 46 freehand, 18 geometry, 26 model (all first grade) and 2 each for freehand, perspective and model 2 nd grade.

By permission of the Managers the school will be closed on Monday next Whit Monday.
" 30 Notice of the Religious Knowledge Exam. was received and duly posted according to requirements by the Vicar - the date is June 29th.

June 1st Drawing taken this afternoon in place of Arithmetic. We are not working exactly according to our new time table. We cannot well do so, until the children are reclassified. We are daily expecting the return of the Duplicate Schedule, it being three weeks tomorrow since our examination took place.

June 6th Duplicate Received to-day. All the children have passed except 6 in Stand I and one each in Stand III \& IV. The percentage of single passers obtained in proportion to the possible number is 85,80 , and 78 in Reading, Writing,

June 13 The new arrangements consequent upon the re-classification \& under a new time table are beginning to work smoothly after a week of more than ordinary disorder \& scantiness of work.
" 15 Stormy weather has considerably affected the attendance this week, both as regards number present at all, and the average of attendance of those who have been present at all.
" 16 Benjamin Hallam was severely beaten for persistently telling a lie.
" 19 D. W. Chadwick is away by permission of the Managers to-day.
June. 22. Report received today. The grant for Grammar has not been taught given, because taught only according to Code 1880. The additional work of 81 Code not being noticed.

June 28th Considering the favourable weather the attendance is poor; but being the week before the Wakes, probably some are employed in preparation for this festival.

June 29th School closed for the Wakes and Summer Holiday by permission of the Managers for five weeks, to re-open August the seventh.

August 7th School re-opened with very poor attendance. The hay has not been gathered in as was anticipated during the long holiday just over.

Aug. 16th The Rev. H. Buckston visited the School, and distributed prizes to a numer [sic] of children who passed at the recent examination in three subjects.

Aug. 17th School met and closed a few minutes earlier than usual, on account of annual teaparty in connection with the Sunday school.

Aug. 21st William Townsend is present, though marked otherwise by P.T. I have altered the registers accordingly, and instructed the P.T. to count the children actually present in future, \& so avoid further errors.

1882
Aug. 23rd Pupil teachers both half an hour late at lessons this morning.
Aug. 29th The annual excursion in connection with the church choir, took place yesterday. As a number of children intended going it was thought advisable to close the school for that day.
Aug 31st School opened a little later this afternoon and registers marked a little later (2-20), but in sufficient time to allow of the two hours attendance required by the department, as the school closes at 4.20.

The drawing report has been received today, and is very unsatisfactory. Out of 86 papers no less than 41 are reported failures. Such a result was contrary to expectation, as owing to an unusual delay in the return of the duplicate Schedule, extra time was devoted to drawing as is shown by the Log Book entries for the latter part of May this year.

Sep. 4th Being Castleton Wakes Monday, and a favourable harvest day too, we have an extremely poor attendance at school to-day.

The junior pupil teacher particularly re-quested not to touch the children under his
instruction.
Sep. 11th Another week has commenced today with a poor attendance. Many of the older children are assisting in the corn.
" 12. Diocesan Inspection - holiday in consequence.
" 18. Upper Standards (IV - VI) kept in considerably after the remaining children closing time. The attendance officer visited the school this afternoon.
" 19. Holiday tomorrow on account of the Annual Agricultural Show. The attendance is poor today.
" 27. The attendance is very much improved, but still a number of boys in Stands. $\forall$. IV. V. \& VI. are away assisting in harvest work.

October 4. Our attendance is still suffering as when the entry of September 27th was made, \& today the cattle fair at Castleton still further diminishes our School attendance. Many of the children in the upper standards have now been continuously
absent for this month. The Merit Grant will probably, (in it higest[hic] degree) be gained only with difficulty.

Oct 9th Rather scanty attendance to-day.
Oct 11th Very wet, and very poor attendance in consequence. Stand VI is very thinly represented.

Oct 13 The Rev. H Buckston visited the school; the attendance was noticed to be small by that gentleman. This is accounted for by the rainy morning, and by the occurence of Hathersage Fair this day.

Oct. 16 Three boys have returned to school today after being continuously absent for fifteen weeks, and one who has been absent for fourteen out of the fifteen weeks just passed. They are all necessarily backward. An East wind has probably caused a number of girls and young children to be absent to-day.

Oct 19. The weather is still unfavourable \& in consequence the attendance is still small.

Oct. 26th The attendance is improved this week. The visit of the Attendance Officer usually takes place on the last Wednesday in the month \& many parents make a special effort to have their children in attendance on that day.

Name (No) 14, boys' register shows an alteration in its marking for this morning. The child came in just after I had marked him absent at three minutes before ten :- the time for the closing of register.

Oct 30th The attendance is very scanty :- very heavy rain having prevented those who reside at a distance \& many of the younger children who live near from coming.

Nov. 6th The usual holiday will be given this afternoon for the usual fifth-of-November celebrations. Yesterday being Sunday accounts for the peculiarity of celebration the 5th on the 6th .

Nov. 7th Copy books not used this morning, the Arithmetic lesson being prolonged specially.

Nov. 13th Many of the children are away today. Some
of the boys are in engaged in potato getting. A succession of harvest employments detain the older children, and the compulsory Clauses of the Education Act are but feebly administered in respect to these illegal employments.

Nov. 15. Arthur Cane, a Douglas (Isle of Man) boy, was admitted and duly registered as a scholar this morning. His unfamiliarity with the English accent will probably be a cause of difficulty in his progress.

No sewing this afternoon, the sewing mistress being unable to be present.

Nov. 20. Stormy weather to-day has caused a great number of children to be absent.
Nov. 20. The Rev. H. Buckston visited the school - The girls were rather late going to sewing this afternoon.

Nov. 21 One child did not answer \& so was marked absent, but was discovered present when the children were counted.

Nov. 28. The Rev. H. Buckston visited the school this morning. The master was absent from school through illness during the latter half of the week.

Dec 1st School opened at 1.5 this afternoon and registers closed at 1.30 . \& the school closed at 3.45. This alteration of arrangements has been made by the consent of the Managers. The master left the School at 3 oclock, in charge of pupil teachers, he having to go to Sheffield.

Dec 5th There are only about fifty scholars present today. D.W.Chadwick, the senior pupil teacher is away from duties owing to a severe cold.

Dec 6th The sewing mistress is unable to come to-day. The illness of a member of the family is the cause. The attendance is again very scanty to-day, bad weather preventing the little ones and those who live distant from school.

Dec. 7 4th There are only twenty three children present this morning, out of a total of 109 on the books. Not a single infant is present.

Dec. 13 The attendance has continued very small since the heavy snow fall a week ago. The school [impossible to be sure of the very faint written words but probably something about children who reside at a distance having difficulty attending] The grouping of the children has been slightly altered, and departures from the time table arrange

ments have been several times necessary.
Dec. 15th The impassable state of the roads continues, although a thaw seems to have set in. The depth of the snow has been 9 to 12 inches on levels, \& drifts as high as 9 feet have had to be cut through in the neighbourhood. Old inhabitants do not
remember such an exceptionally inconvenient state of the roads. The Royal Mail cart was lost in the snow for a day or two \& horsemen had to carry the bags.

The account of the roads to here given, is entered to explain the reason of the unusually small attendances registered during the last fortnight.

Dec. 21st School closed to-day for Christmas Holidays to re-open Tuesday January 2nd 1883.

Jany 9th Two boys punished for cutting desks (J. F. Proctor and Geo. Bradbury)
Jany 10th No sewing this afternoon - the Sewing Mistress being unable to attend. A funeral caused this absence.

Jany 11th The junior pupil teacher again cautioned about using his hands to the children in his charge - (see entry Sep 4th 1882)

Jany 17 The Rev. H. Buckston visited the school to-day.
Jany 19th A boy on the upper boys' register having being re-called after the books were marked and summarised for the week, a number of alterations in red ink have been made. The Rev. H. Buckston visited the school.

Jany 23 rd The attendance is much improved with the improved state of the weather. Bad weather has seriously damaged the average for this quarter.
