

Instructions to those Visiting the Chairmen of the various Urban and Parish Councils.

Call only at these places on your list.

- 1 See that the chairman or his deputy has received the letter and is acting.
- 2 If no one is acting—get someone—the clerk will advise—to act.
- 3 See that the *two* posters are actually exhibited in prominent positions.
- 4 That names are being carefully entered up with full details on the registers.
Duplicate copies of the registers should be kept by the chairman.
That the sheets as filled will be posted to the Territorial Association Secretary at Derby or at latest by the 20th inst.
- 5 Report any difficulties or suggestions that are made to you.
- 6 Suggest that chairman should invite people of local influence to attend the meeting.
- 7 The chairman to be asked to kindly ascertain in their respective areas, the names and addresses of wives and families of men who have joined the regular Army and Navy, who are already in need of assistance.
Ladies would help in collecting this information which should be sent to the Secretary of the Association at Drill Hall, Derby.
- 8 Report to the Officer of your district the results of your visits, daily as made.

DUKE OF DEVONSHIRE'S CALL TO ARMS.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR VISITING OFFICERS.

Every Parish Council and Urban District Council in the County is to be visited to see that the Chairmen are taking steps to bring the call before the people so that none can say they have not had their chance of undertaking some service for their Country.

The County has been divided into three areas for the purpose of this inspection North, South and East. The South has been placed under Col. Wright Bemrose, the East under Col. Jackson and the North under myself.

The Northern area includes the Unions of Hayfield and Glossop, Chapel-en-le-Frith, Bakewell, Ashbourne and such parts of the Belper Union as lie North of the line Ambergate, Cross of the Hands - Osmaston - Norbury.

I have sub-divided my area into four groups and made the following allocations of Townships

No. 1. - HAYFIELD AND GLOSSOP

Capt. Welch of White Hall, Chinley, in charge. He will ask Mr. Brown of Chinley to place his car at his disposal for the purpose of visiting the places within his area - Mr. Brown has placed his car at the service of the Country.

No. 2. - CHAPEL-EN-LE-FRITH. Capt. Boycott in charge.

I have allotted Mr. Britton of Longstone and his car to him. He has placed it at the service of the Country.

No. 3. - BAKEWELL Union (less Matlock, Matlock Bath, Cromford, Bonsall, Darley Dale, Tansley and Wensley)

Lieut. Glossop with Mr. A.W.J. Eyre in charge.

The latter has placed his car at the service of the Country.

No. 4. - The remainder of Bakewell Union, Ashbourne Union and such parts of Belper Union North of the line of Ambergate,

Cross of the Hands, Osmaston, Norbury - excluding those places - Lieut. R. Arkwright of Willersley in charge
Mr Arkwright will make his own arrangements.
