- 1927 Library re-organised on "Open-Access" system on First Floor Lending Library (with Children's Corner) in room now Reference Library Reading Room in room now Children's Library. Reference Library and Offices in room now Offices. West Ward Reading Room closed.
Librarian: L. C. Jackson. Annual Issue: 266,610 volumes.
1929 New Reading Rooms opened in Church Way.
1936 New Children's Library opened (in Room previously Reading Room).

2nd Re-organisation

- 1939 Annual Issue: 435,980 volumes. Reference Library and Adult Lending Library transferred to Ground Floor (vacant due to the opening of the new Town Hall in 1938). Exhibition and Lecture Room provided on First Floor (in room now Reference Library). Four Book Depots were established in shops on the outskirts of the town to meet the difficulties caused by the black-out and earlier closing hours.
1944 Librarian: G. R. Micklewright. Annual Issue: 564,525 volumes. From 1944 many improvements were carried out at the Central Library to meet the increasing demands on the Library Service. A part-time Branch Library was opened at Old Whittington in 1955 and at the same time, the Hospital Service was extended to all the five hospitals in the area. A School Library Service was commenced in 1952 and there are now 24 School Libraries. The Library became a member of the East Midland Regional Library System. The Library was designated as the town's Information Bureau and the Borough Librarian became responsible for the production of the Official Guide, Directory and Street Map.
1954-55 Annual Issue: 714,035 volumes.

1955 - 3rd Re-organisation

- In April 1955, the Reading Rooms at Church Way were closed and adapted for Exhibition and Lecture purposes. During May and June the Reference Library was transferred from the Ground Floor to the First Floor. The wall between the Old Lending Library and Reference Library was removed and the new Lending Library layout completed, providing twice the accommodation previously available. The Staff accommodation was re-arranged and the Children's Library was given new lighting, a new floor covering and additional shelving. The whole scheme cost under £3,000.
1959 Committee given the responsibility of developing and organising Cultural Activities.
1961 Committee made responsible for the administration and control of the Swanwick Memorial Hall, Old Whittington, the Branch Library accommodation being enlarged and improved.
1963 A Branch Library at Newbold, incorporated in the new Littlemoor shopping development, is ~~now being built, and should be open~~ in the summer of 1964. [A new Central Library is phased for 1965/7 and the site is now being determined. The Committee is also considering the establishment of a Mobile Library Service.
