Denby Apprentices 1719 - 1830

Introduction

This typescript brings together the pertinent Apprenticeship information from the surviving apprenticeship documents for the parish of Denby, which are deposited in the Derbyshire Record Office. They comprise:

All of the above documents have been microfilmed and are available in that form (Ref: XM 1/292 item 10).

In most cases, the apprentices were poor or pauper children who qualified because of their circumstances to have their apprenticeships arranged and paid for by the Overseers of the Poor of the parish. This even applied to poor or pauper children who had moved from the parish, as it was the parish of their settlement that was responsible for their apprenticing.

The information given in the documents varies considerably, as though most of them are pre-printed forms, their format varies in the information that had be added by hand. It does tend to be the case that later the date of the document the greater the amount of information required.

At the back of this typescript there are both surname and location indices.
