# Hartington Nether Quarter Parish Apprentices

1749 - 1796

#### Introduction

This typescript brings together the pertinent Apprenticeship information from the surviving apprenticeship documents for the parish of Hartington Nether Quarter, which are deposited in the Derbyshire Record Office. The documente were deposited by Mr R. Thornhill of Great Longstone. They comprise:

D307 Box J Apprenticeship Indenturea 1749 - 1796

The apprentices were, in all cases, except for the earliest indenture of 1749, classed as paupers and thus qualified to have the cost of their apprenticeship paid for by the parish. However, this does mean that their indentures were exempt from the tax levied upon them during the period 1710 - 1808, so they should not appear in the relevant Inland Revenue volumes at the Public Record Office for between these two dates. Although Hartington Nether Quarter wasn't at this date actually a parish, it did have Overseers of the Poor who carried out a parish's function of apprenticing pauper children.

The indentures are in all cases except for that of 1749, pre-printed forms with the relevant details added by hand, but this unfortunately meant that in most cases the details of the apprentices parentage are not given and in one case this also applies to the occupation of master.

At the back of this typescript there are surname and location indices.

## Hartington Nether Quarter Parish Apprentices 1749 - 1796

#### 1749

Thomas Barker, son of John Barker of Newhaven in the parish of Hartington Nether Quarter, is apprenticed to John Thacker of Manchester, in the county of Lancashire, baker, for 7 years. Indenture dated 4th November 1749. Premium £7.

#### 1757

Mary Bateman, daughter of Richard Bateman of Hartington Nether Quarter, is apprenticed to John Ball of Hartington Nether Quarter, farmer, to learn the art of housewifery, until she attains the age of 21.

Annie Dawson, daughter of Samuel Dawson of Hartington Nether Quarter, is apprenticed to Peter Featherstone of Hartington Nether Quarter, husbandman, to learn the art of housewifery, until she attains the age of 21. Indenture dated 2nd July 1757.

#### 1764

Hannah Higton of Hartington Nether Quarter is apprenticed to John Johnson of Hartington Nether Quarter, to learn the art of housewifery, until she attains the age of 21 or marries. Indenture dated 5th May 1764.

## 1767

Jane Goodwin of Hartington Nether Quarter is apprenticed to John Hobster of Hartington Nether Quarter, farmer, to learn the art of housewifery, until she attains the age of 21 or marries. Indenture dated 2nd May 1767.

## 1772

John Dawson of Hartington Nether Quarter is apprenticed to William Buttler of Heathcote in the parish of Hartington Nether Quarter, husbandman, until he attains the age of 21. Indenture dated 8th July 1772.

# 1796

Adam Slater of Hartington Nether Quarter is apprenticed to William Townshend of Taddington, framework knitter, until he attains the age od 21. Indenture dated 24th December 1796.
