

MILLER MUNDY FAMILY OF SHIPLEY

Shipley was acquired by the Leche family through the Strelley and Vavasour families in the sixteenth century. In the late seventeenth century Hester Miller nee Leche inherited Shipley. The estate passed to her daughter Hester who married Edward Mundy (1706-1767).

The Mundy family were based at Markeaton, Mackworth and Allestree. The estate had been bought in the early sixteenth century from the Touchet family by Sir John Mundy, Lord Mayor of London 1522-1523, who claimed Derbyshire family connections. His descendants were connected with Markeaton until the early twentieth century. Edward Mundy was descended from a younger son of John Mundy of Markeaton, great great grandson of Sir John.

Edward Miller Mundy I (1750-1822), son of Edward Mundy and Hester Miller, inherited Shipley in 1767. He married three times. His eldest daughter Frances married in 1795 Lord Charles Fitzroy, second son of the 3rd Duke of Grafton, and Georgiana, his daughter by his second marriage, married Henry, 4th Duke of Newcastle, in 1807. His second son (General) Godfrey Basil (died 1848) married a daughter of Admiral Lord Rodney and their son Admiral Sir George Rodney Miller Mundy (1805-1884) had a distinguished naval career in the Americas, Baltic, Mediterranean and China Seas. His third son (Admiral Sir) George's naval career included service under Lords Collingwood and Nelson during the Napoleonic war. His youngest son (Sir) Robert (1813-1892) was a colonial governor in the West Indies and Central America.

Edward Miller Mundy I was active in local politics, serving as High Sheriff and as MP for Derbyshire for thirty nine years. His eldest son Edward Miller Mundy II (died 1834), who inherited Shipley, did not follow in his father's political footsteps but his son Edward Miller Mundy III (died 1849) served as MP for South Derbyshire. Edward Miller Mundy III was succeeded by his brother Alfred (1809-1877) who had been Colonial Secretary for South Australia in the early 1840s. He and his son Alfred Edward Miller Mundy (1849-1920) both served as High Sheriff of Derbyshire. Alfred Edward's son Godfrey Edward Miller Mundy (born 1885) sold most of the estate to Shipley Collieries Ltd. in 1923 and made his home in Hampshire.

Shipley Hall was built about 1700 by Colonel Miller, husband of Hester Leche, and rebuilt in 1788. There are plans for the garden by William Emes in 1772. The house was demolished during the 1939-1945 war.

The family's main source of income was from property including collieries in Shipley, Heanor, Allestree and Mapperley. The records include title deeds 1501-1895 and rentals 1796-1833, as well as various marriage and other settlements

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which detail acquisition of properties. For Shipley manor there is an abstract of title 1627-1716 and a survey 1805.

There was extensive coalmining in Shipley and in Heanor where the Miller Mundy and Charlton families were the main proprietors. The records include colliery accounts (incomplete) 1757-1874.

The family also had property in Over Mayfield/Staffordshire, Sandon/Hampshire, Loxley/Warwickshire, London and other counties. There are title deeds 1520-1823 for out-county properties.

The account book of Hester Mundy (later Lady Newdigate) 1767-1772 includes names of servants. Edward Miller Mundy I's accounts 1772-1781 include household and estate information, as do those of his second wife Lady Middleton covering 1782-1787. Edward Miller Mundy II's cash book includes farm summaries 1824-1826. There are household and estate accounts for 1825.

Correspondence 18th-19th centuries covers a range of personal and estate affairs, including colliery and canal interests, Heanor enclosure and family correspondence, including some from Australia. A visiting list for the London season 1810 probably belonged to Nelly, sister of Edward Miller Mundy I.

George Miller Mundy's naval career is reflected in correspondence with Lords Collingwood and Nelson including a description of the capture of Le Furtet by HM *Hydra* 1806-1807, log books of the ships *Leander* 1820-1821 and *Sattelite* 1822 and commissions as Admiral 1846 and 1857.

Edward Miller Mundy I's second wife was the widow of the 4th Baron Middleton. It is probably through this connection that the records include correspondence and receipts relating to the estates of the 3rd and 4th Barons Middleton 1772-1783. A book of medicinal and household recipes from the early eighteenth century may also originate from the Middleton family. There is some correspondence 1801 about legacies left by Hester Lady Newdigate, Edward Miller Mundy I's sister.

An account book 1682-1697 of Edward Mundy probably belonged to a brother of Gilbert Mundy, younger son of John Mundy of Markeaton, from whom the Shipley branch descended. The account book includes personal and household information and refers to living in Markeaton, London and Allestree.

A ledger recording merchandising or cargo space contracting in London 1661-1662 was later used to record rent receipts 1742-1779, but there is no clear connection with the Mundy family.

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The records were deposited by a firm of solicitors in 1968 and 1978, with a transfer of additional records from Derby Library in 1978.

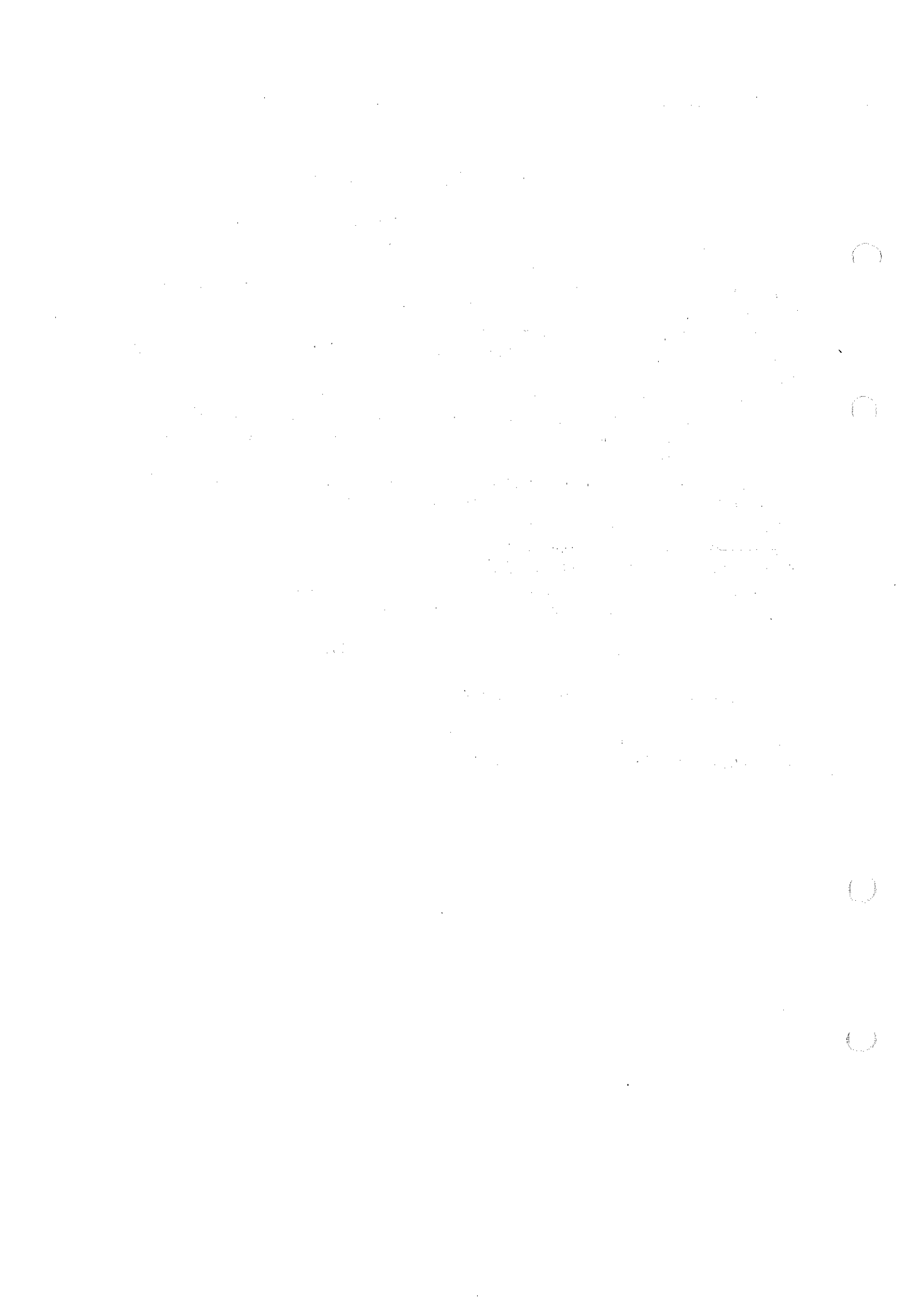

"Whereas I, Georgiana, Dowager Baroness of Middleton, have purchased £1,000 capital in three per cent Consols which now stand in the joint names of Sir Robert Lawley, Bart of Carwell, Staffs, and Andrew Hackett of Moxshull, Warwicks, upon trusts which I shall appoint, do direct that they shall yearly supply 20s part in buying pious books at their discretion and of the Minister and Churchwardens of the Parish of Middleton, to be distributed as mentioned, and the rest and residue after the expenses of the trust to provide a schoolmaster or mistress for those children whose parents have no means to pay."

We went over to the Bank this day but, being a holiday, we could not obtain any answer about it. We will call again tomorrow and, as soon as we obtain any information of what is necessary to be done, we will write you directly."

Letter from Vere & Co of London to John Harrison of Derby, Solicitor. Dated 20th January.

1801

"We wrote you a few lines yesterday and this day, with difficulty and some expense, we have got the will of the late Lady Newdigate registered at the Bank, but the writer of this was obliged personally to appear before the Lord Mayor and make affidavits to certain things relative to the will before it was suffered to be registered. We now send a power of attorney to be signed by Miss Mundy which, when done, will enable our Wm Smart to transfer £500 Consols to Miss Sarah Shilton. Enclosed is also another power to be executed by Miss Shilton which, when done, will enable said W.S. to transfer the £500 Consols to the trustees in her intended marriage. The Bank would not grant a power to transfer £600, giving for reason that £500 only was bequeathed, that the remainder must be transferred into the name of the executrix, who might then give a power to dispose of all or any part thereof as agreeable to herself. Please write again the names of Miss Shilton's trustees and the full description of their places of residence."

Letter from Vere & Co of London to John Harrison of Derby, Solicitor, regarding Miss Shilton's legacy. Dated 21st December.

1801

"We wrote you yesterday enclosing two powers of attorney but, as Miss Shilton's settlement cannot be completed without £100 Consols more, in addition to the £500 in the powers sent you yesterday, we now send another power which, when executed by Miss Nelly Mundy, the executrix, will enable us to fulfill the bequests in the late Lady Newdigate's will and without which Miss Shilton's settlement must be impeded, unless Miss Mundy will give us leave to buy £100 Consols for Miss Shilton, in addition to the £500 and debit her (Miss Mundy's) account for it, in which case the £500 and £100 Consols could be put into the trustees' names at the same time, and Miss Mundy could retain in her own name the £100 Consols which belong to Miss Shilton or, at maturity, sell them as agreeable to herself. As it was some time before we could get the will proved we, by virtue of the old power, received the half-year's dividend on the £3,800 Consols and placed it to the late Lady Newdigate's account, so that Miss Mundy will be entitled to the balance after accounting to Miss Buckley for six months dividend on £500 Consols and to Miss Shilton for six months on £600 do. PS note: Dividend on £3,800 Consols is £57. Pray mention again the names of the trustees, and also mention where Miss Mundy's place of residence is, also Miss Buckley's. All these are necessary things."

Letter from John Harrison of Derby to Miss Nelly Mundy at Shipley. Dated 22nd January.

1801

"Since Mr Frederick Mundy called here today I have received from Messrs Vere and Co another letter of attorney for transferring to Miss Buckley the £500 stock legacy left to her, and then for transferring the remaining £2,800 into your name, which I understand from the Bankers could not be done till Miss Shilton's and Miss Buckley's legacies were transferred to them, and that the £2,800 must be put into your name before you can transfer £100 of it, for which Lady Newdigate was trustee for Miss Shilton. You will therefore please to execute the two letters of attorney which my son waits upon you with, and return them by him to me. And I will immediately forward them to Messrs Vere & Co, and request them to get the transfer completed without delay and to send another letter of attorney for transferring the £100 to Miss Shilton's trustees. I also send you a power of attorney for Miss Shilton to sign, authorising Mr Smart to accept the £500 legacy for her and then to transfer it to her trustees. You will please to forward this to Arbury, to be executed by Miss Shilton, and then to be sent by her to the Bankers in London, that the transer may be made. And you will also please to desire that she will attend to the instructions at the foot of the power of attorney as to filling up the date and witnessing it."

"When Sir Roger Newdigate sent the names of the trustees he did not mention where Mr Tomkins lived, which you will see by Messrs Vere & Co's letter is necessary to be known by them. So that when Miss Shilton sends them the letter of attorney she should send the names and addresses of both the trustees as they are described in the settlement, and you will mention to her the remaining £100 will be transferred by you to the trustees. I am sorry that this business has been so delayed, but that has not been my fault. You will see by Messrs Vere and Co's letter that it has been occasioned by the peculiar circumstances of the case. The proctor's bill for the probate of Lady Newdigate's will stamps is £45.1s.1d. If you will please to send me an order upon Vere & Co to pay me the amount of the dividends which they have received, I will discharge the proctor's account therewith when I am in London. Pray return this letter to me."

1791-1872

Many pencilled notes in the 1794 edition and an indication that Mundy *max* and [General] Mundy *ma* were listed as 5th formers in the earlier one. There is a second copy from 1865 cover-marked A[lfred] M[iller] M[undy]. [The lists may originally have been acquired on the entry of two of the sons of Edward Miller Mundy I and added to during the education of the next generation. Alfred Miller Mundy was born in 1849, so would have been 13 or 14 during term time in 1863.]

1810

Beginning with the Dowager Duchess of Newcastle, the Duke

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and Duchess of Newcastle and a number of other peers, and ending with Mrs Barwell. [The 4th Duke of Newcastle had married Edward Miller Mundy's daughter Georgiana in 1807, and Edward was to marry Mrs Barwell in 1811. The diary may have belonged to Nelly, the youngest and now only unmarried sister of Edward Miller Mundy I.]

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INVENTORY BOX (Shelf No.434/1)

Box labelled 'Inventory' after the first account heading in one of two ledgers of identical manufacture but different number of pages. Also contains identification slip reading 'No.63 - Miller-Mundy - Ships Logs?' for no explicable reason [except perhaps that some such logs are contained in Box B].

[INVENTORY/1]

The thicker of the two ledgers was first used to contain the cashbook accounts of Elizabeth Clerke and John Tufnaye, "in equal halves" and was "begun in London on 14th June 1661", continuing in such use until August 1662 (using first 12 open folios only). The nature of their business is difficult to discern, but seems to have been some sort of merchanting or chartering of cargo space. The parties concerned do not appear to have had any connection with the Miller Mundy family.

1661-2

The volume was thereafter reused to record rent receipts from a great number of people, again having very little obvious connection with the Miller Mundy family, although William Wrightson is noted as one of the creditors in 1748 [about 1689 Francis Mundy of Markeaton married Philippa, only daughter and heiress of Michael Wrightson of Osbaston]. William Lockley is noted as a tenant of land in Ladbroke, Warks, in 1743, and there is a tenancy rental of that place for the year 1754 [which might just point to use of the volume on behalf of and in succession to Jane Norcliffe, who was widowed in 1735 and died in 1749, when the Warwickshire properties came to the Mundys].

The thinner of the two ledgers was used to contain the "Journal or Day Book containing all merchandise accompts and dealings belonging to me, Edward Mundy, from 28th March 1682." Such heading is only to be found towards the back quarter of the ledger, being preceded by individual category or client accounts, the first of which was labelled 'Inventory' and so caused this document box to acquire its rather odd label.

[Edward Mundy, the owner of this ledger, was almost certainly the youngest of the four sons of John Mundy of Markeaton (who died in 1681), in which case it was he that became MP for Derby in 1710 and died in 1713. Francis, the eldest of John's sons, died without issue in his father's lifetime and it was William, the second son, who succeeded to the Markeaton estate. The third son was Gilbert, Sheriff of Derbyshire in 1697 and ancestor of the Mundys of Shipley - Edward Mundy of Shipley (1706-67) was the son of Gilbert's son Robert (1675-1708).]

There are accounts for Funeral Charges, Corne, Wool, Lead, Langley Farm, Voyage to Barbadoes, 'my brother William Mundy' and 'my brother Gilbert Mundy', law charges being paid to William Mundy and Hugh Bateman. Mention is also made of a cousin Edward. The ledger seems to have been begun when Edward was still in the family home at Markeaton, moving to London in March and April 1693 and then to Allestrey. He was in London continuously from May 1693 and in Allestrey again thereafter. The volume closes on 16th October 1697.

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Chapel House farm and the manor of Mapperley, together with extensive properties at Kidsley and Smalley had been purchased and subsequently mortgaged for various sums in excess of £3,000, followed by other purchases in Mapperley, Smalley and West Hallam, mortgaged separately.

Expansion of the estate, particularly into Heanor, where the extensive mineral rights were shared with the Charlton family of Chilwell, continued and the mortgages were gradually redeemed during the tenancy of Alfred Miller Mundy, brother to the third Edward, and more especially after another settlement of the estates made in concert with his son Alfred Edward Miller Mundy in 1872. Upon the death of the latter in 1920, to be succeeded by his son, Godfrey Edward Miller Mundy, arrangements were made to terminate settlement of the estate within the family, most of the property being transferred to Shipley Collieries Ltd in 1922, from whom the principal parts of the Shipley estate eventually passed together with the mines into the hands of the National Coal Board in 1946. The papers concerning preservation and maintenance of the estate until termination of the settlements in 1922, including most of the records of the Nutbrook Canal Company and various leases of the minerals but few technical details concerning the operation of the mines remained in the hands of the solicitors to the trustees of the final settlement until 1966, when they were presented to the Derbyshire Record Office.

He hath purchased two-thirds of the colliery and driven a heading a number of yards into his own estate, sinking two pits, one of them a deep foundation to reach all coals on the estate for a generation, the agent having charged Fletcher fully one-third of the sinking costs. Can Mundy lift water into the sough without Fletcher's consent and are the heirs entitled to one-third of the profits arising from same? Can the agent compel Fletcher to pay for the foundation in Mundy's own estate? If the sough is casually an advantage to drain other lands, Mundy is entitled to use it, but no expenses arising outside the lands described may be charged to the partnership. If Mundy chooses to work the mine in his own estate at the expense of the partnership, they will either be entitled to share the profits or disclaim the work as they please. R. Bakewell.
