

# Melbourne Parish Apprentices

1698 - 1835

## Introduction

This typescript brings together the pertinent Apprenticeship information from the surviving apprenticeship documents for the parish of Melbourne and King's Newton, which are deposited in the Derbyshire Record Office. They comprise:

The apprentices were, in most cases, classed as paupers and thus qualified to have the cost of their apprenticeship paid for by the parish. However, this does mean that their indentures were exempt from the tax levied upon them during the period 1710 - 1808, so they should not appear in the relevant Inland Revenue volumes at the Public Record Office for between these two dates.

In theory, there should exist matching indentures for every entry in the Register of Parish Apprentices, and in most cases this is so, but there are entries for which no corresponding indenture survives, particularly where the apprenticeship was subsequently cancelled. Conversely, there are surviving indentures for which there are no matching entries in the Register.

In the case of the two transfers of an apprentice from one master to another, the indenture between the original master and the apprentice has not survived. There is also a case where the apprentice came from Winshill, but as the master came from Melbourne, it is probable that a copy of the indentures had been deposited with the Melbourne parish authorities, and thus has survived with the rest of the indentures. There are a further two cases where apprentices no longer living in the parish were apprenticed by the parish, but it is likely that the apprentices settlements were at Melbourne, and thus they qualified that way.

The indentures themselves, vary considerably in format and information given. Most of the 18th century ones are pre-printed forms with the relevant details added by hand, but this unfortunately meant that there was no room for details of the apprentices parentage. In a few cases, a second copy of an indenture has survived as well.

The records themselves have been microfilmed (Ref: XM43/49 items 8, 9 & 10) and are available in that form at the Derbyshire Record Office.

At the back of this typescript there are surname and location indices.

Indenture dated 31 May 1805. The indenture was cancelled by mutual consent on 11th October 1805, as the apprentice has absconded and had not served 40 days.

By a further indenture dated 19th April 1812, William Strelley agrees to transfer William Thompson's apprenticeship to Edmund Frearson of Nottingham, Nottinghamshire, butcher, for the remainder of the term of the indenture.
