### Introduction

The German Pole Charity of Radbourne was set up under the terms of the will of German Pole who died in 1683. The aim of the charity was the apprenticing of poor children from the six townships of Radbourne, Mercaston, Mackworth, Markeaton, Dalbury Lees and Mickleover, with each township able to put forward one apprentice a year.

The earliest Minute Book covers the period 1686 - 1753 and it is believed to be still in the possession of the Chandos-Pole family at Radbourne Hall. For details of this Minute Book see the article by W.G. Briggs entitled 'Records of an Apprenticeship Charity 1685 -1753' which appeared in the Derbyshire Archaeological Journal (DAJ) Vol. 74 (1954) pps 43 - 61.

The second Minute Book covers the period 1754 - 1819 and this is a calendar of the apprenticeship entries that it contains. For no year do all six townships put forward an apprentice, and in cases where a township did not put forward an apprentice, the £8 that would have been spent on the apprenticeship would instead go to the Minister and Churchwardens of the parish to be distributed amongst the poor.

There are a total of 115 apprentice entries (including three that were crossed out) and to up to 1779 the names of two sureties are also usually given. The calendar includes all names, occupations, relationships and placenames but excludes certain details concerning the conditions of the apprenticeship. A typical entry in the Minute Book for 1812 reads:

#### Markeaton

Ordered that Joseph Creswell, son of Edward Creswell of Markeaton, labourer, be put apprentice to Samuel Allsop of Hulland, cordwainer for seven years, the Master to find the Apprentice meat, drink. washing, lodging, wearing apparel and all other necessaries during the term & give him ten shillings & a new suit of clothes of all sorts at the end of the term.

This will have been rendered in the calendar as:



#### Introduction

The German Pole Charity of Radbourne was set up under the terms of the will of German Pole who died in 1683. The aim of the charity was the apprenticing of poor children from the six townships of Radbourne, Mercaston, Mackworth, Markeaton, Dalbury Lees and Mickleover, with each township able to put forward one apprentice a year.

The earliest Minute Book covers the period 1686 - 1753 and it is believed to be still in the possession of the Chandos-Pole family at Radbourne Hall. For details of this Minute Book see the article by W.G. Briggs entitled 'Records of an Apprenticeship Charity 1685 - 1753' which appeared in the Derbyshire Archaeological Journal (DAJ) Vol. 74 (1954) pps 43 - 61.

The second Minute Book covers the period 1754 - 1819 and has been separately calendared. The third Minute Book, of which this is a calendar of the apprenticeship entries that it contains, covers the period 1820 - 1895. From the 1820's onwards the old limit of a maximum of one apprentice from each township per year appears to be disregarded, though in cases where a township had no suitable candidates for apprenticeship, the Overseers of the Poor received the money in lieu, as laid down by the will of German Pole.

There are a total of 193 apprenticeship entries, but the amount of information for each varies. For the period 1823 - 1862, the date of the indentures is usually given and also the premium paid to the Master. From then on, the amount of information varies considerably, with in few cases, the location and occupation of the Master not being given. However in the period 1869 - 1882 in a total of 12 cases, it is possible to work out the date of birth of the apprentice as the age at last birthday and its date are given.

There is also, after the calendar, separate Surname and Location Indices.
