

Repton Apprentices

1703 - 1837

Introduction

This typescript brings together the pertinent Apprenticeship information from the surviving apprenticeship documents for the parish of Repton, which are deposited in the Derbyshire Record Office. They comprise:

Of the above documents only D638 A/PO 485 - 583 have been microfilmed (Ref: XM 1/363 item 3) and a few of the documents were missed.

The apprentices were, in most cases, classed as paupers and thus qualified to have the cost of their apprenticeship paid for by the parish. However, this does mean that their indentures were exempt from the tax levied upon them during the period 1710 - 1808, so they should not appear in the relevant Inland Revenue volumes at the Public Record Office for between these two dates.

The indentures are in most cases pre-printed forms with the relevant details added by hand, but this means that there can be considerable variation in the details given. Normally the apprentice comes from the parish of Repton but some cases the apprentice and his/her parents come from outside the parish of Repton. This usually implies that although the apprentice and his/her parents have moved to another parish, the apprentice has a legal settlement at Repton, which makes the parish Of Repton responsible for his/her apprenticing if he/she qualifies.

John Peale is apprenticed to Thomas Norton of Tutbury in the county of Staffordshire, until he attains the age of 22 which is 7 years. No occupation given. Premium 1s. per quarter. Indenture dated 17th November 1711.

Henry Stretton is apprenticed to John Radford of Nottingham in the county of Nottighamshire, weaver & woolcomber, for 7 years. Indenture dated 30th April 1713.

Thomas Ashwood is apprenticed to John Sumerfield of Burton upon Trent in the county of Staffordshire, tailor, for 7 years. Indenture dated 5th June 1713. A memorandum added on 3rd October 1713, states that John Sumerfield is lately deceased and that with the assent of Edward Sumerfield, his grandfather, the apprentice has been apprenticed to John Heawood of Mickleover for the remainder of the term and Edward Sumerfield agrees to pay John Heawood the sum of £4.
